We're thankful for any gift you leave to us in your Will, however big, small or unusual. Bequests in your Will can include:

- A share of your estate. After you have provided for your family and friends, you can leave a share, or the remainder, of your estate to us. This is called a "residuary gift".
- A cash gift. Known as a "pecuniary gift", this is when you leave an exact sum of money to charity. It's really helpful if you consider index-linking such gifts to allow for the effects of inflation over time.
- A specific gift, for example shares in a company.
- A reversionary gift. You can leave a gift for someone to use over a period of time, for example, a house for the duration of someone's lifetime. When the time has ended, the asset can be given to a charity.
